day 1: thursday

12:00pm: Arrival at The Porches Inn

In the shadows of the Massachusetts Museum of Contemporary Art (Mass MoCA), these old mill houses turned chic inn will be our starting point. With an expansive view of Mass MoCA, this row of beautifully detailed 19th Century Victorian row houses pays homage to generations of mill worker families who once called them home.

12:30pm: Welcome Lunch

Our leaders will welcome you to Blank Canvas Tours, give you a rundown of what to expect for the trip and introduce other guests. A private buffet lunch will be served at the Porches Inn.

2:00pm: Mass MoCA

Experience a private guided tour of more than 250,000 square feet of visual contemporary art. The expansive museum includes one of the largest open space exhibits in the world, all in a uniquely renovated historic mill building. There will be time to explore the museum on your own following the guided tour.

4:00pm: Mount Greylock

For a scenic view of fall foliage from the tallest mountain in the state, you'll have the option of heading up to the summit to take in peak fall foliage in the Northern Berkshires.

7:00pm: Dinner at Mezze Bistro

Dinner will be served at Mezze Bistro, an exquisite hometurned restaurant with a focus on farm-to-table food and fine dining. This might be our team's favorite restaurant in the Berkshires!

8:30pm: A Capella

Ephlats is an all-gender a cappella group from Williams College. The group derives its name from the college mascot (a purple cow affectionately known as Ephelia, or an Eph for short), and is the most enduring a cappella group at Williams, with an alumni network of over 300 former members. Singing a wide range of musical genres, you can find the Ephlats performing popular songs to jazz standards to original compositions.

day 2: friday

7:30am: Breakfast at The Porches

Served in the Main Dining Room, you can dine at your leisure that morning.

10:00am: The Clark Art Institute

You will receive a private, guided tour of the permanent collection on view at this world famous art museum, which will be followed by time to roam and experience the three summer exhibitions in the other galleries. The Clark sits on a unique 140-acre ground and features European and American paintings, sculpture, prints, drawing and decorative arts from the Renaissance to the early twentieth century. The collection is especially rich in French Impressionist and Academic painting, British oil sketches, drawings and the work of American artists Winslow Homer, George Inness and John Singer Sargent. You can lunch at one of two on-campus cafes, and will have time to walk the scenic trails behind the museum.

1:00pm: Explore Manchester, VT or Take a Scenic Hike

We'll depart Williamstown and take the scenic drive up to Vermont, where there will be multiple options.

Option A: Shop in Manchester/Dorset

You can explore Manchester and it's many outlet stores, all situated within a picturesque town in the mountains of Vermont.

Option B: Hike Prospect Rock Trail

Prospect Rock Trail is a 3.1 mile out and back trail that features a waterfall and is rated as moderate. You can enjoy lovely flora and fauna, babbling mountain streams, and rewarding summit foliage views.

3:30pm: The Dorset Inn

Get settled into your room and relax before an evening of fun. The Dorset Inn is quintessential Vermont, with charming rooms located in the quaint town of Dorset. The Dorset Inn has been rated by Yankee Magazine as one of the top 18th century inns in the country!

7:30pm: Performance at the Dorset Players

A historic barn turned theatre, the Dorset Playhouse has been around since 1927 and is a staple of New England theatre. Offering a wide variety of plays and performances, the Dorset Players will be an exciting highlight for our group. A talkback with the actors will be available following the performance, exclusive to Blank Canvas guests.

10:30am: Hildene, The Lincoln Family Home

Our group will take a private tour of Hildene, the historic home of Robert Lincoln, the only son of President Abraham Lincoln and his wife Mary Todd Lincoln. Hildene remained occupied by descendants of the Lincoln family until 1975, when the next to last descendant of the Lincoln-Harlan family, Mary Lincoln Beckwith, passed away there. The estate features 412 acres, half of which includes meadows and wetlands while on the inside, the Hildene is furnished almost entirely by Lincoln family furniture, and contains artifacts belonging to Robert Todd Lincoln and his parents.

12:15pm: Lunch at Hildene

A catered lunch at Hildene overlooking the grounds will be served.

1:30pm: Oldcastle Theatre, Southern Vermont Arts Center or Shop

Option A: Oldcastle Theatre

Located in downtown Bennington, The Oldcastle Theatre Company will be celebrating its 48th season in 2019!
Originally formed by five New York actors in 1972, the OTC presents at least one new play each season and has premiered plays by well-known writers as Elliot Hays, Reginald Rose and Bob Shanks. Tony winning actresses such as Karen Ziemba and Emmy winning actors and directors such as Richard Thomas, James Goldstone, Melissa Leo, Larkin Malloy and others have worked with the company over the years.

Option B: Southern Vermont Arts Center

Enjoy a private guided tour of the Southern Vermont Arts Center, a historic estate turned gallery-space featuring sculptures, local artists and regional works. A true hidden gem.

Option C: Shop in Manchester/Dorset

You can explore Manchester and it's many outlet stores, all situated within a picturesque town in the mountains of Vermont.

5:30pm: Dine at the West Town Eatery

Chef's Rogan and Abby Lechthaler bring an inspired, locally-sourced, of the moment menu for our group! The restaurant is located on property at the Weston Playhouse and will allow you to enjoy top-flight food, spirited cocktails, and warm hospitality; all complemented by the best view in town—Weston's historic mill & falls.

7:30pm: Weston Playhouse

Vermont's oldest and longest-running professional theatre, the Weston Playhouse offers some of the best summer theatre in the state. From classics like West Side Story, to world premieres, the playhouse continues to grow its footprint every year, adding a brand new Center of the Arts that is soon to be unveiled. Depending on production announcements, this may be swapped for the Dorset Theatre Festival.

Experience a private guided tour of the Bennington Museum, home to the world's largest collection paintings from famed folk artist, Grandma Moses. She was able to capture the excitement of winter's first snow, Thanksgiving preparations and the new, young green of oncoming spring... In person, Grandma Moses charmed wherever she went. A tiny, lively woman with mischievous gray eyes and a quick wit, she could be sharp-tongued with a sycophant and stern with an errant grandchild."
